Theological Worlds

This week as I was preparing to lead premarital counseling I pulled Keirsey and Bates' *Please Understand Me* from my shelf. For those of you who don't know it, this is the

basic guide for couples—or really anyone in relationships with other people, so all of us really—to help us understand our own personality type as well as that of our partners, friends, children, co-workers and all those we meet. The theory, based on the Myers-Briggs personality types, is that by better understanding our similarities and differences we can look at problems through a more reflective lens and thus reach more creative solutions.

This month in worship and study group we are exploring theological world views. Theology is the study of God, but Karl Barth, and most theologians, would argue you can't study God without also studying humanity and our relationship with God. Thus theology becomes the study of God, in all God's expressions, humanity and our interconnectedness. Just as we each view the world through our own personality types, we also view the world through our own theological lens.

In his book *Theological Worlds: Understanding the Alternative Rhythms of Christian Beliefs*, W. Paul Jones lays out five worlds:

- Separation and Reunion
- Conflict and Vindication
- Emptiness and Fulfillment
- Condemnation and Forgiveness
- Suffering and Endurance

Each world is defined by two extremes, our greatest fear and our greatest hope, and people live within the tensions between the poles. He suggests that we all have one theological world that dominates our experience of God and faith and it is within this tension that we encounter God.

Part of the role of a pastor is to be a theologian within a community helping the gathered members to see God in their own lives, to celebrate the divine encounters and to search through our rich heritage of rituals, practices and language to find comfort and hope amidst life's challenges. But truly the work of theology cannot be done by the pastor alone. We are all on our own individual journeys with God; seeking to know and be known by the one who made us. If we do not each take seriously the work of theology, we risk missing encounters with God.

You are invited to take the 60-question Theological World Inventory, to read the descriptions of the five worlds and wrestle with the tensions that Jones identifies and then worship with us. As we explore each of these five worlds in worship think about how the hymns lift up the deep hope of that world. Listen to the prayers with an ear toward the fear of that world. What scriptures speak to this world? How do these worlds fit your experience? What's missing from Jones' model? Our hope for this series is to gain self-awareness and understanding of those around us so that we might strengthen our community.

The study group on Theological Worlds meets each Wednesday during February at 7 p.m. in the Bethel Library. The Theological World Inventory is available from Pastor Kristen.

Donation boxes are just inside the church's entrance each Sunday morning, and are located outside the church office weekdays.
