### Trim the Tree and Deck the Halls!

The Christmas season is here. Black Friday has come and gone with its door-buster deals. Christmas music floods the radio and holiday lights are popping up on every street corner. Each year, it seems, there is a story about Black Friday, or Thanksgiving Thursday as it may become, where shopping madness has gone awry. The huge deals are so good that people are willing to do anything to get there before the inventory is gone. Whether it is a fight over Tickle Me Elmo or a man trampled to death on the stoop of Walmart, it seems that the true reason for Christmas has been forgotten and all that remains is our capitalistic, market-driven culture of materialism.

Advent is the church's response to this amnesia. Advent is the four-week period when God calls us to pause and prepare, not for a holiday of gift giving, but to prepare for a holy day when we meet God face to face. Christmas is a holy day because God became one of us. Christmas is a holy day because God began a journey toward a cross and an empty tomb so that death would not have the final word. Christmas is a holy day because the invisible God of the universe became visible and dwelled among us. Christmas is a holy day because God's love was made known, not in a general's violent victory, but in the birth of a child. In God all things are possible.

In worship this Advent we will gather around the manger each week, looking, watching and waiting as we hear the words of the

Bethel is receiving a gently used organ that arrives Tuesday, December 2<sup>nd</sup> and be fully installed and tuned for Worship on the 7<sup>th</sup>. It comes to us from Vinson Hall. It is the same type of organ as our current one, but more than 20 year younger. Our old organ was about 47 years old and we were expecting some expensive repairs in the next year to keep it functional, even as the sound quality continued to deteriorate. Have you already been overwhelmed by the vast amount of commercialism associated with Christmas? Concerned that the true meaning of Christmas might be lost in the loud volume of the neatest-andgreatest-thing? Want to possibly dial back on adding yet another material good to your household and instead give something with a deeper and more pure meaning?

Well, Bethel has your answer.

This year Bethel is holding our Living Gift Market on two Sundays following Worship, the 14th and 21st of December, and it presents us with the opportunity to give a gift that continues to give beyond just the immediate. Instead of giving to ourselves, we give to those elsewhere that are in need. We have three groupings of gifts:

- Church World Service: examples of gifts include blankets, seed packets, educational toys, mosquito nets and emergency family food package

- Arlington Academy of Hope: Bethel sponsors the scholarship for Joshua to attend elementary school at \$360/year.

The Living Gift Market is a great chance to make a new Christmas tradition, and also teach your children/grandchildren/ family/friends about the joy of giving to others, as you can give in their names as well as your own. The Market will be held in fellowship hall after worship. We look forward to see-ing you at the Market on the 14th and 21st of December!

## Dec. 7 Congregational Meeting Agenda Items

Our next Congregational Meeting is scheduled for Sunday, Dec. 7th following Worship. The meeting will be preceded by a potluck lunch.

After several months of discussions and listening sessions, we will vote to modify our Open and Affirming Statement to recognize marriage equality. The proposed new language, which both Spiritu-

al Council and Consistory have approved, is printed below right, along with the current statement.

We will also vote on our church budget for 2015. The Finance Committee has proposed a balanced budget of \$158,953 specifying how our gifts and donations will support the various missions of Bethel.

Finally, we will nominate a

chair of our Nominating Committee and give a short overview of the various positions to be filled for 2015 (see the box at left).

### Final Draft for Congregational Vote Dec. 7:
