30 Years of Open and Affirming BY PASTOR KRISTEN CURLEE

This month the General Synod of the United Church of Christ gathers in Cleveland, Ohio to conduct the business of wider church.

On its agenda is a revision of our Constitution and Bylaws, the election of the next General Minister and President and an important anniversary. This year the UCC celebrates 30 years of being an Open and Affirm-



ing denomination with more than 1,000 churches joining the movement.

In 1985, having already ordained the first openly gay man in 1972 in San Francisco and the first openly gay woman here in the Potomac Association in 1981, the United Church of Christ became the first mainline denomination to welcome and affirm all people regardless of sexual orientation. The resolution began:

Whereas, the Apostle Paul said that, as Christians, we are many members, but we are one body in Christ (Rom. 12:4), and Jesus calls us to love our neighbors as ourselves (Mk. 12:31) without being judgmental (Mt. 7:1-2) nor disparaging of others (Lk. 18:9-14); and

Whereas, recognizing that many persons of lesbian, gay and bisexual orientation are already members of the church through baptism and confirmation and that these people have talents and gifts to offer the United Church of Christ, and that the UCC has historically affirmed a rich diversity in its theological and biblical perspectives; and

Whereas, the Tenth through Fourteenth General Synods have adopted resolutions encouraging the inclusion, and affirming the human rights, of lesbian, gay and bisexual people within the UCC.

I will have the opportunity to attend Synod. I look forward to celebrating this important anniversary that widened our welcome and gave a voice to many who had been marginalized and excluded for generations.

After prayerful consideration and study, Bethel followed many of our brothers and sisters in Christ to become an Open and Affirming congregation more than ten years ago. This year we took the next step to live into that Covenant as we affirmed marriage equality. The scriptures remind us that God made all of God's children in God's image and God's vastness is made known in our diversity.

As marriage equality came to Virginia, in January, I was invited to officiate a wedding for Mark and John. They had a Holy Union service more than 20 years ago and have built a life together. They have been together in sickness and in health; in good times and bad; in the ups and downs of family, work and the loss of beloved pets. And on the anniversary of that first ceremony I was with them when we signed a marriage license making their vows legal. I give thanks to the United Church of Christ and Bethel that I was able to celebrate with Mark and John without wondering what the members of my church might think or without looking over my shoulder to see if someone from my denomination would try to take away my standing as a minster. Thank you for being part of the radical hospitality to which God calls us so that we might enjoy—the gifts of all people. This Pride Month there is much to celebrate.

Pick up a bag or two in Fellowship Hall. Bags have instructions attached asking neighbors to contribute groceries for distribution by Arlington Food Assistance Center (AFAC). Then collect bags *before Sunday*, *June 7* when we will bless all donations at our 10 am worship service with special guest AFAC Executive Director Charlie Meng. (Instructions on the bag will also invite neighbors to bring their food donations to this service, if they wish.)

For over 25 years, the **Arlington Food Assistance Center** has been distributing groceries, directly and free of charge, to people living in Arlington who cannot afford to purchase enough food to meet their basic needs.

While hunger might not seem to be an issue in a wealthy county like ours, the high cost of living here combined with the current economic situation mean that many families struggle to make ends meet. Groceries from AFAC help families remain in their homes, workers stay on the job, children able to learn better, and mothers and babies have the nutrition they need.

AFAC currently distributes groceries to nearly 2,200 families every week. More than one in every three people served are children.

Families need a referral to receive food from AFAC to ensure that clients are legitimate, and that all of their needs are being assessed and addressed. Referrals must come from an Arlington County government agency or local churches, schools, or social service agencies.
