On the Horizon

Advent is here. It is the season of waiting and preparing. It is the season of anticipation and expectation for a new beginning. Advent starts four Sundays before Christmas, beginning this year on November 30th, and stretching to Christmas Eve, as it does every year. Advent is not specifically mentioned in the Bible, but it is an ancient Christian practice, fin



Bible, but it is an ancient Christian practice, first observed in France in the fourth century. The word Advent comes from the Latin word adventus, which means coming, and hints at the focus of this liturgical season.

This Advent we prepare, as in years before, for the coming of Jesus, the Christ, and with his birth the fulfillment of God's promise for the world. It is the promise of the Messiah to free humanity; the promise of God made flesh to show us the way to live and love; the promise of Christ's final victory; and the promise that the light of Christ living in our hearts burns bright every day. But this year is also different than years before because this year we also wait and prepare for our own new beginning.

This is the time of preparation for a new ministry; the next chapter in Bethel's almost 75 year history here in Arlington. There will be plenty of time to dream new dreams about

DONATE ONLINE

If you are a regular visitor to Bethel UCC's website (www.bethelucc-va.org), you may have noticed that Online Giving is now operational. It allows members and friends the option of keeping up with those pledges and giving regularly even if you cannot make it to church every Sunday.

As you click through you will enter a secure portal where you can give on a regular basis or for special collections. You will enter checking account information and your account will be debited for the amount and at the frequency you specify.

How You Can Make a Difference This Christmas With a Small Gift!

In San Luis Talpa, El Salvador - Maria has 2 small children and a spouse, Juan, who cannot find any regular work – so they survive off of \$20-\$30 a week. Eating only 1-2 meals a day – with most meals consisting of a corn tortilla, a small piece of cheese and a piece of mango (when in season), the family has nothing left over to pay for any medical care.

So when Abram or Julietta is running a high fever and crying in pain, Maria has no money to buy any Tylenol or take the children to a doctor. Bethel UCC, pairing our efforts with La Luz Verdadera, has made it possible for Maria, Abram, Julietta and Juan to get regular check-ups and a doctor's visit when one of them is ill – they can even receive small amounts of over the counter medicines to help ease pain or antibiotics for an infection.



We make this possible at Bethel both by donations to pay the salary of Dr. Lissette Alfaro, a Salvadoran doctor who staffs the Faro De Luz medical clinic in San Luis Talpa El SAlvador and by donations of over the counter medications and vitamins. We have been fortunate to have some generous donors in the past who gave on a monthly basis and/or left a gift for Faro de Luz clinic in their wills. We are now close to exhausting this reserve fund.

We are challenged to maintain the clinic and could use the help of those who would donate on a regular basis in whatever amount they wish. A donation of \$5 covers the cost of a doctor's visit and over the counter medications. A donation of \$35 covers the daily salary cost for Dr. Lissette. If we could build up a group of 23 families each willing to donate \$35 a month, we would be able to provide for Dr. Lissette's salary.

Would you donate \$5 a month – or \$35 – or any amount that you feel called to give to Faro De Luz Clinic? You would be making a big difference for the children, the elderly and fami-

lies in El Salvador who cannot afford primary health care. Donations are made to Bethel UCC with a memo note for Faro De Luz clinic – and are tax deductible.

Alternative Giving Market

When children at school told me that Santa Claus wasn't real and I went crying home to my mother, she explained to me that Santa Claus was the Spirit of Giving. As long, she said, as people were willing to give to others in the world, Santa Claus was alive and well.

Here at Bethel, Santa Claus is kept alive and well through our Alternative Gift Market. Each year, we offer you the opportunity to give a gift that will benefit someone in need instead of just adding more stuff to the pile in yours or someone else's home. The Alternative Gift Market works with three different charities and allows you to give in your own name or in the name of someone else.

First, the Gift Market works with Church World Services where you can donate to provide seeds or tools for gardening, literacy classes and small business grants, or emergency food packets. Your donations travel around the world improving the lives of adults and children in places of need.

Secondly, the Gift Market works with our ministry of supporting the El Salvador Clinic. Bethel supports the doctor's salary there of \$600/month.

Finally, the Gift Market also works with our support of children's ministry friend Joshua through the Arlington Academy of Hope. Bethel currently sponsors his elementary education at \$360/ year, and we hope to continue to support his education through high school.

Please join us in supporting these wonderful charities this year at Bethel. We will be collecting donations during Fellowship time on December 6th, 13th, and 20th.
