

Conversation Sabbath

Arlington County's newly formed Coalition to Improve Advanced Care (CIAC) has invited all faith communities to participate in Conversation Sabbath—a week-long event November 11-20 during which faith leaders will be teaching and preaching on the vital importance of having conversations about one another's wishes for care at the end of life.

Pastor Carolyn will preach at Bethel on November 13 on the consecration of our whole lives, including stewardship of our last days. She will also teach the Wednesday night Bible study on November 16.

Update: AFAC + Bethel's 2016 Cereal Goal

AFAC began serving 300 families a week in 1988. The current projection for November 2016 is 3,000 families. The need for food donations continues to be a great demand. Bethel set a goal for donating 600 boxes of cereal this year. Currently through September 294 boxes have been delivered. That leaves 306 boxes.

Can we meet our goal? Let us try! Thank you for all that you have already donated. Reminder next bagging date is Friday, December 2.
